POLICY STATEMENT

- 1. Judo Ontario strongly opposes the use, possession, and the supply of banned substances and practices by Ontario athletes, coaches, trainers, medical staff, other support personnel, administrators, and officials. Through affiliation to Judo Canada, members of Judo Ontario are bound by the Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP) run by the Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES).
- 2. The CADP is a set of rules with respect to the use of prohibited substances and methods in sport adopted by national sport organizations (NSO) and multi-sport organizations (MSO) that serves to protect the integrity of sport and the rights of clean athletes. The CADP is compliant with the World Anti-Doping Code (Code). Organizations, athletes, athlete support personnel and other persons belonging to sport organizations that have adopted the CADP accept these rules as a condition of participation in sport and agree to be bound by these rules.
- 3. Judo Ontario as a member organization of Judo Canada is committed to supporting the CCES and Judo Canada in their mission to ensure and clean and fair sport environment.
